

POCKLINGTON CANAL.



Day Tickets from the usual outlets.

Open all year round

From Canal Head (Pocklington), to East Cottingworth, Approximately nine and a half miles.

Match sections, Canal Head, Hagg Bridge above and below, and East Cottingworth

No fishing near boats in Melbourne Marina

This venue offers the pleasure, match and specimen angler a great variety of top class sport throughout the year.

It fishes well for pike, some to a very large size, in winter and in the summer produces good catches of 'wild' tench and bream to early or late anglers. Roach shoal up in the winter and pole and punch produces.

At the Pocklington end 'Canal Head' a number of platforms suitable for the disabled have been installed and this short stretch offers good sport with mixed silver fish in comfort.

The other stretches are often weedy and over grown and provide a tranquil setting to fish in peace. There is very little boat traffic.

For the Canal head follow the A 1079 from York and turn off the main road opposite the Wellington Oak Pub just after the airfield.

For other sections take the B1228 through Sutton on Derwent to Hagg Bridge the follow the network of lanes along the Canal.

Park on the roadside at various bridges along the canal, except at East Cottingworth, where a track at the North end of the village takes you down to the canal. Turn right just before the First house.

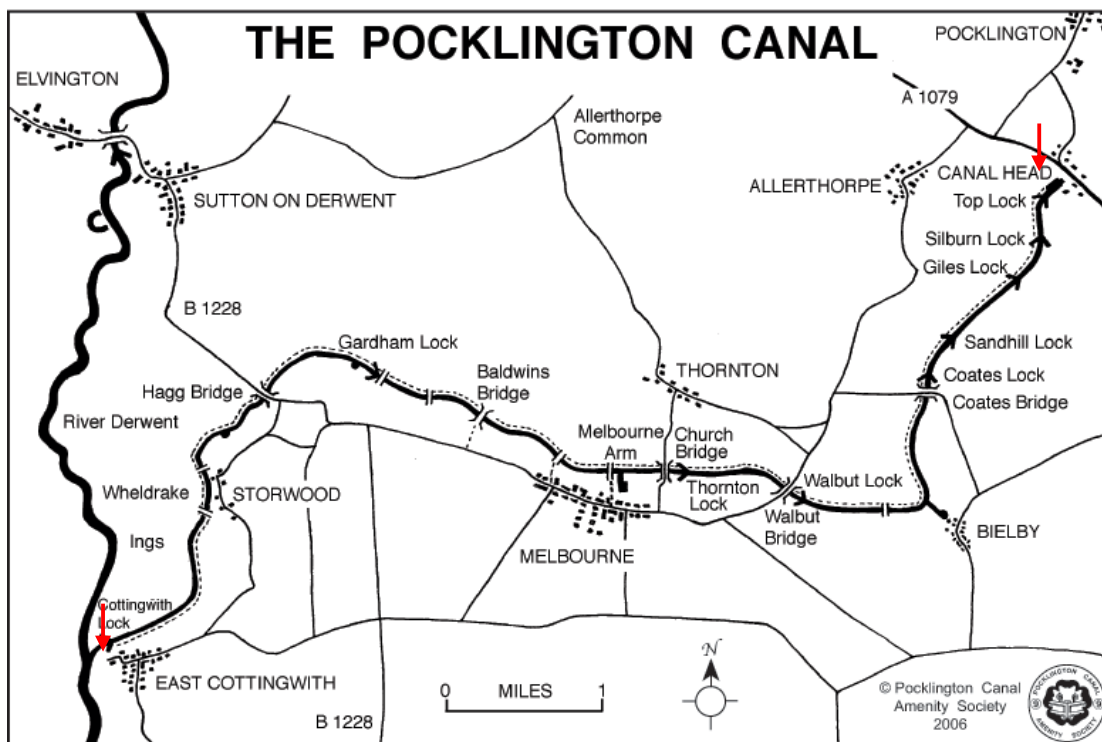
